Commissioner Johnson moved to waive procurement and authorize the Chairman's signature on the Boulder Associates Authorization to Proceed with Professional Services for the Memorial Hospital of Carbon County Site and Building Survey in the amount of \$47,112 plus reimbursables of an estimated \$4,000 for a total amount of \$51,112.00. Commissioner Espy seconded and Chairman Jones clarified that the building survey will assist the county in developing funding priorities for the hospital. It will also assist the hospital in obtaining grants as well. Clerk Bartlett reported the timeline is 6 weeks from when the contractor can begin to obtain a complete report. 

NATIONAL LIFE INSURANCE MONTH



September is National Life insurance Awareness Month. This is a time for you and your family to reflect on whether you have the right coverage for your financial future.

Life insurance can be an important part of your family's long-term financial planning. However, shopping for coverage can be intimidating. All life insurance policies have one thing in common; they're designed to pay money to the beneficiaries when you die. A beneficiary can be one or more individuals or even an organization. In most cases, policies are purchased by the person whose life is insured, but life insurance policies can be taken out by spouses or anyone that is able to prove they have an insurable interest in the person.

There are many different types of life insurance policies. However, they generally fall into two classes of life insurance: term and cash value. There are also separate "riders" that allow you to modify or add to your policy's benefits. Each individual's situation is different, therefore you should reach out to an agent that is licensed to sell policies in your state.

Here are some of the terms you will hear when discussing life insurance.

Term Life insurance: is a policy that is purchased for a period of time (term). The policy pays money to the named beneficiaries if the insured dies during the term. Term life insurance is intended to provide lower-cost coverage for a specific period. Term life policies may

include a provision that allows coverage to renew at the end of the term. However, those premiums may be higher than the original policy. Before you renew, ask what the premiums will be.

Cash Value life insurance: is a policy that you can keep for as long as you need it. These policies also have savings or investment features, which make it possible for policy owners to get money from the policy while they're still alive. Whole life, universal life and variable life are types of cash value policies.

Life insurance riders give you a choice to add coverage that isn't in your life insurance policy. Adding a rider will increase your premium. Some riders that may be added are:

Waiver of premium rider- you can stop paying your life insurance premium if you develop a covered illness or disability named in your rider. Also check if there is a wait time before the insurer waives the premiums after diagnosis.

Accidental death benefit rider will pay more than the death benefit if you die in an accident. Be sure to check how the rider defines an accident.

Guaranteed insurability rider lets you increase your death benefit at certain times in the future without a medical exam. How much is costs to increase the benefit will depend on your age and the amount of the increase, not your health or lifestyle.

Long-term care rider lets you use part of your death benefit to pay for long-term care expenses. There may be a limit on how much of the death benefit you can use. Also, you may be able to use the benefit only for certain types of long-term care expenses, such as a

nursing home or home health care.

Accelerated death benefit lets you take money from your death benefit if you're diagnosed with a terminal illness and expect to die soon. Be sure to check the rider to learn what terminal illnesses qualify and what the insurer requires.

Be sure to speak with your agent about each of these riders, and ask if there are any other riders to consider, to determine if they are needed for your situation.

Finally, it is possible that a loved one has passed away and you are not sure where to find their life insurance policies. The National Association of Insurance Commissioners has a free online too that is available to anyone and is one of the ways the insurance department can help consumers get their entitled insurance benefits. The tool will ask you questions regarding the deceased's information. After you complete all required fields, you will submit your request. The request is stored in a secure, encrypted database where participating life insurance companies can access the information through a secure portal. You will receive a "Do Not Reply" email confirming your request. If a policy is found and you are the beneficiary, the life insurance company will contact you directly. If there is no policy, or you are not the beneficiary, you will not be contacted.
